SCHOOL FUNDS






MACOSQUIN P.S FRIENDS' ASSOCIATION

GARDENING WEEK & ECO NEWS



SCHOOL DEVELOPMENT / SHARED READING

This year in Literacy, we will be focusing on the development of Shared Reading time in each class. As well as being able to decode unfamiliar words, pupils also need to develop many other skills in order to give them a better understanding of more difficult texts during their learning journey at primary school. We will also be building on Guided Reading resources, Bug Club and accelerated reading.

<u>Toys</u> e.g. dolls, stuffed toys, toy trucks, harmonica, skipping rope, ball, small puzzles, yo-yo etc.

<u>School Supplies</u> e.g. pens, pencils, sharpeners, crayons or felt pens, stamp & ink pad sets, writing pads or notebooks and paper, solar calculators, colouring and picture books etc.


<u>Hygiene Items e.g.</u> toothbrush, bars of wrapped soap, comb or hairbrush, flannel etc.

<u>Other items</u> e.g. hat, cap, gloves or scarf, sunglasses, hair accessories, jewellery set, wind up torch, slinky spring, matchbox cars etc.

Due to more stringent import regulations, toothpaste and sweets can no longer be included in shoeboxes.
