We are now in our second year of rolling out this scheme and children are now receiving two lessons per half term. In September of this year all staff were trained in Digital Storytelling and in particular how to use the app 'CLIPS'. Children from P1 to P7 have enjoyed exploring Clips and presenting their work to other classes and their peers.




HEALTHY BREAKS
